

Opportunity Resource Services Upward Bound & Upward Bound Math and Science will begin offering field trips for students participating in the 2020 Summer Program starting on Tuesday, June 30, 2020, and ending on July 15, 2020. Students are not required to attend trips and will not be penalized for missing a trip.

Student and staff safety is our number one concern, to ensure the safety of everyone, we will only allow each student to attend ONE trip. Each trip will only have 13 students and one staff member to ensure that proper social distancing can take place on the buses and in venues. Each staff member will only attend 1-2 trips to limit exposure.

Each staff member and student will have their temperature checked with a no-contact forehead thermometer before they can board the bus. Per the Center of Disease Control guidelines, if a temperature is 100.4 degrees or higher, the student's parents will immediately be notified and the student will not be allowed on the bus. Students and staff will also be asked screening questions about whether or not they have displayed symptoms of COVID-19.

- Have you had any of these symptoms that are not attributable to another condition?
  - Fever or chills
  - Cough
  - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
  - Fatigue
  - Muscle or body aches
  - Headache
  - New loss of taste or smell
  - Sore throat
  - Congestion or runny nose
  - Nausea or vomiting
  - Diarrhea

Students and staff will maintain social distancing at each location they visit, proper handwashing will be encouraged, and hand sanitizer will be provided by ORS Upward Bound for students to use. Buses will be cleaned and sanitized before boarding and in between each trip stop.

Students and staff mask procedures: Students and staff **MUST** wear masks on the bus. Participants may be required to wear their masks at varying locations depending on the rules of the venue. If your student is not able to wear a mask for the required duration, we ask that you use your best judgment on whether or not they should attend.

If a student exhibits any of these COVID-19 symptoms while we are on a trip, they will immediately be separated from the group. The trip will immediately end and all parents will be notified. All participants that were on the trip will be asked to self-quarantine for 14 days, or until we know how the test results come back:

Fever, Chills, Body Ache, Loss of Taste or Smell, Diarrhea, Nausea or Vomiting,  
Shortness of Breath, Difficulty Breathing

Here are other symptoms that we will be monitored should they arise:

Fatigue, Cough, Headache, Congestion or Runny Nose

Transportation will be provided to all students. All students have the opportunity to be picked up at their high schools and students who live within their school's community can choose to be picked up and dropped off at home. If a student does not live in their school's community, they will have to make arrangements to be picked up at their high school.
